


Imagine an artwork you would donate to the museum. Can you draw it?



The stolen Picasso

Above you on the wall hangs a painting by Pablo Picasso. Pablo Picasso was a Spanish painter and sculptor. He became famous for his style of painting—he often depicted landscapes and objects angularly, with straight lines, and people were given mask-like faces. Pablo Picasso lived to the incredible age of 91 and in his lifetime, he made more than 50,000 works of art. He donated one of his paintings to the museum in Skopje! Many people came to see it, but one day the painting was gone!

A thief, disguised as a visitor, was strolling through the museum in Skopje back in 1971. He had a cunning plan, how to take the picture home unnoticed. He carefully took it off the wall, separated the threads, took the picture out of the frame and rolled it up. Then, he threw it out of the window! He casually walked out of the museum, went to the spot under the window where the picture had fallen, tucked it into a big bag and took it home. The valuable painting by Picasso was gone. However, many years later, when the thief tried to sell it, an international police organization called Interpol tracked down the painting and returned it to the museum in Skopje. Now it is on display here at Kunsthalle Wien!
